





# Return Home Interview



# What is a Return Home Interview (RHI)?

- An RHI is an in-depth conversation with a young person who has returned from a missing episode.
- The RHI should be completed by a professional who is highly skilled, trained and independent to a child's care planning.
- An RHI should be offered to every young person on their return from every missing episode.
- An RHI should not only look to establish the reasons why a child has gone missing but also how we can work actively with the child and professional partners to drive down identified risks via the follow-on work offered.






## Who do we work with.....

- All children who have retuned from a missing episode aged under 18yrs old in Newham (not CLA by other LAs)
- We are currently offering RHI's to children who reside in the borough and for children who are looked after by Newham LA but currently reside outside the borough/across the UK.
- The majority of children being offered an RHI are male by gender when looking at gender re the number of individual children not the number of missing episodes
- We acknowledge that for many of the children we work with there are on going concerns for their safety/welfare and we accept that they live with a range of complex care needs.

# The Theory.....

- We use and are underpinned by the Relational SW Model in that we understand and support the value of building trusted relationships with our children. We are relentless in our approach to connecting with our children whilst always maintaining the highest level of respect and diplomacy.
- We also understand that Newham CSC operate using the Systemic Model of Practice which is very much aligned with the Trauma Informed Practice we adopted and will continue to operate within.
- We know and accept that Newham LA uses the 'Heart' Model which gives us a shared understanding the expected organisational principles/behaviour. All of the above theories/approaches/models work well together and can be used interchangeably within our practice.



# Good News Story




- Good News Story RHI Service/ASW/Virtual School
- Child: 'Erick'
- Age:17
- Ethnicity: Dual Heritage Black Caribbean and White British
- RHI Worker: Mercy
- Case Overview
- Erick is a young man who has been cared for by Newham LA since he was 16yrs old. He is currently living in an unregulated residential setting and has been since he was 16yrs old. Over the past 6 months concerns have gradually escalated resulting in Erick encountering multiple missing episodes and in Sep 2019 Erick was found in possession of Cannabis and then Possession of class A drugs and was arrested for PWITs Erick was offered an RHI following each episode and engaged with almost all. However, in October Mercy established that Erick was presenting with a low mood and appeared very frustrated, the 'pull' and 'push' factors were identified as the following.
- Accommodation didn't like the setting/environment and found it restrictive.
- Relationship with is ASW.
- Lack of positive activities.
- Wanted to access therapeutic intervention.



- Mercy approached this by exploring with Erick how he felt we could support him best in reaching a resolution, he wasn't sure and so was offered a meeting to address this with his ASW but at that time was so angry that he wasn't willing to do this. Mercy then offered Erick the opportunity to engage with an Advocate so that she could assist from an objective position. This resulted in him then having a meeting with her during which all of his concerns were ascertained/confirmed. He was given the opportunity to set a meeting re date/time/venue and this led to him feeling more informed, supported and confident to have a meeting with his ASW.
- So What.....
- Following this meeting Erick thanked the advocate and was so happy that he hugged her as she left the building. This course of action led to Erick and his ASW's relationship being somewhat restored in that he felt happy to continue working with him as opposed to being allocated to another SW. Erick was referred to CAMHS, offered alternative accommodation to a shared accommodation setting on him turning 18yrs, he also got additional support from the Virtual School Worker in identifying an apprenticeship in Construction that Mercy supported him with by attending the college with him. Erick managed to get a place on this course and is now attending regularly and is very happy. The missing episodes have not stopped entirely but have reduced significantly.

# Themes/Summary

- There is still a concern around unreported missing when it comes children who reside at home not being reported missing to police when there whereabouts is not known.
- Parenting capacity remains a concern for parents/carers caring for our missing/vulnerable children/YP continue to report that they are struggling.
- Pull/Push Factors money, spending time with friends/family, relationship based (girlfriend/boyfriend model often being used by exploiters') desire to be loved/cared for, additional needs impacts on judgement re safe friends/peers association/places and spaces/lack of essential items such as food/shelter/clothing.
- Mapping missing/vulnerable young people important that these meeting are well attended and that information is shared with partners/regularly reviewed.
- Understanding the importance of a return home interview and role of an RHI officer
- Inviting the allocated RHI officer/ Deputy manager to multi agency meetings.

### 14 responses

Health setting

Children stop giving their views to professionals when they don't feel listened to and when they share how they feel and nothing changes from them in their school.

As a result of their feedback, what do we do?

Is this something the police could respond to at this meeting for us to know the reality

We have a team of youth workers who are around college, approachable and available. This has been valuable in terms of info gathering and early identification for us







### How do you feel trust and confidence with the police is being adressed in Newham? 8 responses

Lacking. Schools police used to do more in building trust with students in schools. But we dont see them at all.

Police should go into schools more to start building relationships.

Schools police are spread so thin. They get pulled away from schools so often. We try to book in sessions to build trust but the the SPLO can not attend

Is it being addressed?

At our last DSL meeting, it was quite clear that the police are stretched - we discussed muggings in the local area

Should the police bring the answer to us as a reality

No idea

I understand that there is work going on but it's not known or visible and may only be targeting certain communities


Really important that we look at how some of these recommendations can be actioned in newham
