




### Lead Practitioner Workforce Table

Early Help Workforce	Who is likely to be in this group?
Frequently Lead Practitioner - Workers who support families with whole family needs, frequently act as Lead Practitioner and will coordinate a Team Around the Family (TAF).	Early Help Workers, Social Workers, Key Workers, Youth Justice Workers, IDVAs, Children's Health.
Sometimes Lead Practitioner - Often first to identify need. May lead and will Chair and/or participate in Team Around the Family (TAF) meetings.	Schools, early years settings, education, attendance workers, education mental health workers, Children's Health, Youth Justice Service.
Specialists - who could act as a Lead Practitioner and will be a member and contributor to a TAF meeting.	Housing/Homelessness Advisors, Substance Misuse Services, NHS/ELFT, CAMHS, Midwives, Youth Justice Service, Police, Employment Advisors, Attendance, SEND, Universal Youth Workers.
Signposters and Community Supporters - Workers and Volunteers who support families in the community to access wider support, not usually Lead Practitioners.	Front of House/Receptionists, Voluntary, Community and Faith Groups, Registrars, Social Prescribers, Domestic Abuse Workers, Family Hubs and Children's Centre staff, Library Staff.



Lead Practitioner Guidance: Multiagency Working to Support Children and Families



### What training and support is available for Lead Practitioners?

#### 1. Supervision

To support Lead Practitioners to carry out the duties and functions of their roles effectively, individuals should have access to regular opportunities to discuss the families they are supporting through supervision within their agency and ongoing line management support. Where this is not possible to provide, steps could be taken to seek external supervision for an individual or group of staff that are undertaking this essential role.

#### 2. Multiagency Safeguarding Hub (MASH) Outcome and Guidance

Where the MASH identifies that following a contact, a family might benefit from the support from a specific universal service or agency, the receiving agency will be notified via the Early Help Hub of the appropriate level of need and will be given some recommended actions to support the lead agency and/or practitioner to respond to the needs identified. MASH will obtain consent and discuss the intervention with the parents/carers so that they are clear of the potential support plan and agency that will be supported them. MASH will also clearly highlight the plan in their recommendations.

## Roles for Overview and Scrutiny (Jas) Newham London

- Provide constructive 'critical friend' challenge
- Drive improvement in public services
- Amplify the voices and concerns of the public



## Scrutiny Inquiry



- Improving the lives of Black boys & young men
- Focus on relationship with the Borough Social, political, criminal justice, economic, health, educational
- Research identified systemic and structural racism, inequality and inequity
- Scrutiny Report adopted by Overview & Scrutiny Committee (4<sup>th</sup> June)

#### Key recommendation:

- Develop collaborative capacity changing how we engage
- Tackle systemic and structural inequality underlying conditions

## Collaborative innovation



working collaboratively and imaginatively with people who may not agree, like or trust each other...

### Use of Power and imagination

- Shifts power dynamics
- Facilitates dialogue roles, perspectives, power levels
- Looks at what COULD happen not what SHOULD happen



## Collaborative innovation

## James Newham London



- Embrace conflict and connection building relationships based on mutual understanding
- Experiment our way forward consider what is working, how are people responding and adjust our course. Change approaches so the system is responding to our efforts.
- Step into the game cease to blame others for the problem. Consider the way we need to change things about ourselves and the role we are playing in the system. We are multiple co- creators we can all change something in order to shift that reality.



- Developing to adapt, influence and transform an unpredictable future
- Not a story about what will happen (a forecast or prediction) and not a story about what should happen (a vision or proposal or plan).
- A scenario is a story about what could happen: an internallyconsistent hypothesis about the future that is relevant, challenging, plausible, and clear
- Scenarios are a tool for communicating about and working with an unpredictable future
